

# OLA Statement of Impact: Art

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Throughout each topic teachers should check that content has been learned and remembered, including content from previous years, to prevent it from being forgotten. Retrieval practice is built into each lesson to interrupt the forgetting curve and secure construct in long term memory.

At the end of each unit, teachers will assess the work in sketch books and the main creative task for each unit against the relevant Mastery Key for that unit to decide whether the child is working at Age Related Expectations by the end of each academic year.

By the time pupils leave **Key Stage 2**, they will:

- ✓ Have increased **creativity and self-expression**
- ✓ Have developed **technical skills and control**
- ✓ Have developed their knowledge and understanding of **art and artists**
- ✓ Use art **to support learning in other subjects** (e.g., historical or religious art, scientific diagrams, geographical sketches)
- ✓ Show **problem-solving** and **critical thinking** when designing and planning projects
- ✓ Use art to **support their well-being**, helping to **express emotions and develop resilience**
- ✓ Show increasing ability to **evaluate and refine their own work**

Our goal is to **inspire creativity and confidence in art**, empowering pupils to develop a **lifelong appreciation of creativity and the visual arts**.
