

How to...	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hold a paintbrush and apply the correct amount of paint. How to correct mistakes. Blend colours together to make new ones. Clean brushes using clean water Use line to create effect 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose colours and for effect. Apply glue carefully. Place shapes accurately. Create repeating patterns. Create shapes. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hold an oil pastel. Choose colours accurately. Make a mark. Leave space where colour is not needed. Outline simple shapes with a darker colour. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Create a sculpture using papier mache with a base to hold the shape. Use the appropriate amount of glue to be used so that the sculpture is neither too wet or too dry. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Choose colours and shapes for effect. Apply glue carefully. Place shapes accurately. Create repeating patterns. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use objects to make prints. Use sponges and rags. Make repeating patterns. Control the amount of paint used.
