<p>Religious Education</p>	<p>To the Ends of the Earth</p> <p>Children will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> about Jesus' return to his Father and how he sent the Holy Spirit as a special friend to guide and care for us at Pentecost. about the importance of gathering in the parish church, where they meet friends, sing, and pray together, especially on Sundays. how Jesus teaches us to care for one another and find happiness through relationships with others. <p>Dialogue & Encounter</p> <p>Children will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> about the lives of St Peter and St Paul, understanding their friendship with Jesus and the significance of their feast day. about a different faith from a local community member and find out about their faith's role in their life. 	<p>Stories that support our personal development</p>		
<p>Literacy</p>	<div data-bbox="465 979 698 1066">  </div> <p>Children will learn to read and write the speed sounds that are set out in the published Read, Write Inc programme. The children will learn how to apply their knowledge of phonics and use decoding strategies to read with expression and intonation whilst building up fluency. In writing the children will learn how to form letters accurately, starting with writing simple words and then building up to writing a whole sentence. They will learn how to use capital letters appropriately and how to use full stops. The children will begin learning how to spell tricky (red) words and develop strategies for remembering these. All children are assessed half termly and will move up through the phonics groups when they are ready through the following colour bands: SOUND BLENDING A, B, C, RED DITTY, RED, GREEN, PURPLE, PINK & ORANGE, YELLOW, BLUE & GREY.</p>
