
Teacher introduction

- My name is Halima, or Miss Moni for the students.
- I am in my first year of teaching.
- I studied Primary Education with a specialism in Humanities (at the University of Exeter)
- I have experience in teaching Year 2 and Year 5 during my training. Before my training, I was a learning support assistant working with primary, secondary and A-level students.

Y3 Curriculum

- 6 half termly **English** units The Great Paper Caper, Seal Surfer, Winter's Child, Stone Age Boy, Journey and a poetry unit. In addition we have set reading, spelling/grammar and handwriting lessons.
- **Maths** blocks varying lengths– place value, 4 operations, fractions, length and perimeter, mass and capacity, money, time, angles, shapes and statistics.
- Science 5 half termly units animals inc. humans, forces and magnets, rocks, plants and light
- Topics (geography, history + art) 1 per term. This half term, we will be focusing
 on climate zones around the world in Geography. Other subjects we will be
 exploring are the Stone Age to the Iron Age, Romans and a local study of Torquay
- DT 1 topic per term, taught in a block Pneumatic toys, sewing cushions and constructing castles
- RE 6 topics in total over the year. This term, we are focusing on Creation and covenant.
- Also... PSHE, PE, Music, Computing, French, Handwriting, Times Tables...

Uniform / PE kit

It is really important that the children wear correct uniform and a really good way to prepare for secondary school, where they are particularly strict about the children's appearance. This information can be found in more detail on the school website, but in summary, these are the uniform expectations:

Girls

- Grey skirt, trousers or shorts
- OR Grey pinafore dress (Reception and KS1)
- Grey long sleeved V-neck jumper/cardigan with stripe and school logo
- White collared shirt
- School tie
- Grey tights or white ankle or knee length socks
- Sensible low heeled, plain black shoes-no trainers or sandals
- An appropriate coat to keep your child warm and dry
- In the summer term a navy blue gingham dress may be worn



Uniform / PE kit

Boys

- Grey trousers or shorts
- Grey long sleeved v-neck jumper with strip and school logo
- White collared shirt
- School tie
- Grey or black socks
- Plain black shoes-no trainers or sandals
- An appropriate coat to keep your child warm and dry

P.E. / Games -required for all children

- -Trainers / plimsolls
- White polo shirts
- Black Shorts
- Black tracksuit for winter months

<u>Additional information</u>

- We also ask that sunhats or caps are sent in as we encourage children to wear them in sunny weather.
- Please note that the wearing of jewellery is NOT permitted except simple ear studs and watches – NOT smart watches
- Nail polish and makeup of any kind is NOT allowed
- Hair which is below shoulder length should be tied up with a plain hair band; additional hair accessories are not permitted

We recognise that school uniform items are expensive however, we will not be able to assist in looking for missing items unless they have been clearly labelled with your child's first and last name.
