Class One

We have also been exploring the fascinating world of Aboriginal art, focusing on beautiful moon paintings. We learned that Aboriginal artists often use dots and a variety of tools to create their unique designs. Inspired by this, we designed and painted our own Aboriginal-style moon artworks, experimenting with different moon shapes and colours.














In RE, we have been learning about the Creation Story. We explored our school environment to discover all the wonderful things that God has made for us. We also talked about how important it is to care for God's world and created colourful posters to remind others to do the same. We were very proud to share our posters with our Year 2 friends!

Class Two

In our History lesson this half term, Year 2 have loved finding out about the Great Fire of London. The children became news reporters and reported all the facts that they could remember.

As part of our RE unit Creation and Covenant Year 2 have spent time outside in nature looking at God's creation. We have talked about the wonderful things we can find in nature and looked at their beauty in detail. We sat under the tree and listened to Mrs Tullier read psalm 139 and discussed God's love and care for humanity.



In English we have been reading the book 'Winters Child'. The children worked in pairs to role-play Tom and his mum.

This activity encouraged them to explore the dialogue between Tom and his mum as they shared their feelings about winter. Afterwards, they wrote down their conversations, focusing on using correct punctuation, particularly speech marks in their sentences.













Class Four


We have also loved our PE lessons with Mr Bastow and have been practising some fabulous gymnastic skills.






Class Five

Year 5 have been learning all about coding in Computing! They've explored how to create algorithms, use loops and sequences, and even debug their own program. The children have shown brilliant problem-solving skills and creativity as they brought their digital ideas to life!





As the weather has mostly been good, we've loved taking our learning outdoors using our new orienteering equipment! The children have worked together to follow maps, find clues, and build their teamwork and problem-solving skills. We can also link this to our work in other subjects such as Maths and Grammar. It's been a fantastic way to learn while enjoying the fresh air and our beautiful school grounds!







Class Six

This half term, Year 6 have been exploring the fascinating world of Viking art. We began by studying the key characteristics and features of Viking design, noticing how intricate patterns were prominent in their artwork. The children practised drawing traditional Viking patterns and developed their skills by creating animal-inspired designs, learning how symbolism and detail played an important role in Viking culture.

Building on these skills, they went on to sketch Viking dragon heads, paying close attention to shape, proportion, and texture. To finish our unit, the children combined everything they had learned to design and make their own unique piece of Viking jewellery, showcasing their creativity and understanding of this historic art form.



Year 6 children had an amazing time at Barton Hall this half term! They threw themselves into every challenge — from zip lining and rifle shooting to stand-up paddle boarding and so much more. Everyone showed fantastic teamwork, courage, and enthusiasm throughout the trip. It was a truly unforgettable experience... and hopefully, they all slept for the whole weekend afterwards after such a tiring but super exciting stay away from home!
