At Our Lady of the Angels school, **Handwriting** is taught as a vital skill that empowers children to communicate **with clarity, confidence, and creativity.** Our intent is to nurture handwriting from the earliest stages of mark-making through to fluent, joined script. We provide structured opportunities for children to develop **fine motor control, spatial awareness, and stamina**, ensuring progression that is age-appropriate and inclusive.

Every child is supported to achieve **legible**, confident handwriting. We adapt teaching to meet diverse needs, ensuring that handwriting remains a joyful, achievable skill for all learners. Lessons are designed to be interactive and engaging, blending movement, art, and reflection. We encourage children to take pride in their handwriting, seeing it as part of their personal and academic identity. Fluent handwriting supports literacy, freeing cognitive resources for spelling, grammar, and creative writing. Our intent is for pupils to see handwriting as integral to their success across all subjects.

Our Handwriting curriculum fosters a love of writing by ensuring that pupils experience:

- ✓ **Joyful beginnings** Children are introduced to handwriting through playful, creative activities—patterns, shapes, and letter stories—so writing feels like discovery rather than drill.
- Confidence through progress Step-by step progression ensures every child experiences success, building pride in their achievements and the celebration of small milestones (first joined letters, neat spacing) helps pupils see handwriting as a journey worth enjoying.
- **☑ Opportunities for personal expression** Opportunities to use handwriting in creative contexts stories, prayers, reflections, letters show its power to communicate meaningfully.
- The value of practice Lessons nurture patience, perseverance and courage. Children learn that mistakes are part of growth, fostering kindness towards themselves and others.
