See you all on the Tuesday 24th February!






Whole School Events

Cooking club has been really popular. They have baked cakes, biscuits and scones and they have also made some savoury items such as sausage rolls, pizza and carbonara.





Well done Olivia!





Reception Class

Reception Class have been learning all about how we use oil pastels. We experimented with drawing lines and shapes and blending, before using what we had learnt to draw African animals and their patterns.



We built houses out of bricks and sticks for the Three Little Pigs and acted out the story using masks we had made.




We have been exploring ways of making 5 then 10 in Maths using Numicon and making our own patterns using numbers and shapes.

We welcomed our families to join us for a Stay & Play session and showed them how we learn through play in Reception.



Class One

This half term in History, we have been learning about Mother Teresa and the Taj Mahal. We were very excited to welcome Kartik's mum, who came in to talk to us about her visit to the Taj Mahal. We found out that elephants helped to build the Taj Mahal and that visiting it is a very unique experience. Kartik's mum told us that it has a calm and quiet atmosphere. We really enjoyed listening carefully and asking lots of questions to help us learn new information.





In Art this half term, we have been exploring the work of animal sculptor Pippa Hill. We talked about the unique qualities of her sculptures and shared what we liked and disliked about different pieces of her work. The children then practised their sketching skills, focusing carefully on animal features. After this, we designed our own animal sculptures before moving on to using clay and other materials to model our creations.

We had lots of fun getting messy with the clay and were very proud of our finished animals.



In English this half term, our focus text has been *The Lion Inside* by Rachel Bright. We read the story carefully and explored different features of the book. We then worked on using prefixes, suffixes and adjectives in our writing. After this, we planned our own versions of the story by changing the characters. We took great care and concentration when writing our stories, trying hard to remember everything we had learnt. To practise our Oracy skills, we read our stories to some of our friends and Mrs Harding. Miss Holt was very impressed with our writing.



Class Two


In Science, we have been investigating materials and their properties. We have carried out lots of experiments. We built houses from different materials such as wood, plastic, and fabric, and then tested their strength and whether they were waterproof. We also tested shock absorbency. In this investigation, we dropped eggs wrapped in different materials from a height to see which material prevented the egg from cracking. Finally, we discovered why tyres are made of rubber by rolling balls made of different materials down a ramp to see how far they would bounce back off the wall. We now know that rubber is the best material for a tyre because it absorbs shocks well and bounces back, making it strong and safe to use.



Year 2 presented a fantastic assembly focused on the Gospel value of Courage. We reflected on what it means to be brave and to stand up for what is right in our daily lives. We showed great confidence, teamwork and enthusiasm.



This half term in Art, we have been exploring the work of the famous artist Vincent van Gogh. We have been developing our drawing and painting techniques while studying Van Gogh's iconic Starry Night. We have enjoyed practising lines, swirls and dots, mixing colours, and experimenting with brushstrokes to create texture and movement in our artwork.



Class Three



We had a brilliant time at Kents Cavern where we got to handle artefacts and learn all about life in the Stone Age. Don't worry the skulls were only replicas! Thank you to our parents and carers for making contributions to the trip!



During our visit to the Church of the Assumption of Our Lady, the children took part in Mass and had the opportunity to deepen their understanding of the Eucharist. Father Ignatius welcomed us warmly and guided the pupils through the different parts of the Mass, helping them recognise the prayers, responses, and moments of quiet reflection that shape our worship.

We learned that the Eucharist is a special time when Catholics remember Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. They explored the meaning of the bread and wine, understanding how these become powerful symbols of Jesus' love, and sacrifice. Many pupils were especially interested in seeing the altar up close and learning why it is such an important focal point during Mass.



Class Four

In Art, we have been exploring the imaginative work of Giuseppe Arcimboldo, the artist famous for creating portraits made entirely from fruits, vegetables, flowers, and other natural objects. Using his playful style as inspiration, we created our own pastel portraits, carefully blending colours and choosing objects that could form facial features. We experimented with shading, texture, and composition, and had great fun seeing how everyday items could be transformed into expressive, characterful faces.



We created and led whole-school worship on the Gospel theme of Justice. We chose and wrote the prayers and readings ourselves, thinking carefully about how to share the message with others. Everyone took part in delivering the worship to the whole school, and we felt proud to lead our community in reflecting on what justice means in our daily lives

In our Sound unit, we have been learning how vibrations travel and how sound moves from one place to another. To explore this, we designed and made our own string telephones, experimenting with different materials and lengths of string to see how these changes affected the clarity and volume of the sound. We loved testing our telephones around the school and were fascinated to discover how well sound can travel through a tight, stretched string.



Class Five

Welcome Miss Bentley!

We have had great fun getting to know our new teacher Miss Bentley and have taken real pride in helping her to settle into the Year 5 team. We have shown kindness, and a wonderful sense of welcome, making sure she feels part of our school community from the very start.



In DT, we have been creating our own pop-up books, experimenting with levers and sliders to make characters and scenes move. We have loved exploring how these mechanisms work and have shown great creativity in bringing our ideas to life.



Class Six

Y6 have been working incredibly hard as we continue our preparations for the SATs in May. In the run-up to half term, we completed our mock

SATs — a great opportunity to practise test conditions and show all the progress we've made so far. Mrs Davenport is extremely proud of the maturity, focus and determination we have shown throughout the week. We approached each paper with a positive attitude and gave our very best!



We have been busy putting our Design & Technology skills to the test by creating our very own waistcoats — specially designed for a stuffed toy! Working from a design brief, we carefully measured and produced templates to make sure our fabric pieces were accurately shaped and sized. We learnt and practised key sewing techniques, including running stitch and blanket stitch, to join our materials, as well as how to securely sew on a button. Some of us went even further by using appliqué to add pockets and decorative details, showing our creativity and individuality. We are incredibly proud of the care, perseverance and craftsmanship we demonstrated — the finished waistcoats look fantastic!
